SCRIPTURE READINGS TODAY

- (1) Jeremiah 31:31-34 The prophet Jeremiah explains how God will replace the Old Covenant of Judgment with a New Covenant of Forgiveness of sins, to be fulfilled, at least in part, through Jesus' life, death and Resurrection.
- (2) *Hebrews 5:7-9* It is by Jesus' suffering and death, in obedience to his Father's will, that Jesus established the New Covenant.
- (3) John 12:20-33 The Gospel hints at the inner struggle of Jesus in accepting the cup of suffering to inaugurate the new and eternal Covenant. He accepts the cross as his "hour," meaning the stepping-stone to his passion, death, Resurrection and heavenly exaltation. Finally, his "lifting up" on the cross and passage to heavenly glory is God's assurance that our own sufferings and crosses are not futile, for Christ has intentionally and compassionately aligned himself with us.

Next week's (Palm Sunday) Scripture Readings: (Intro) *Mark* 11:1-10; (1) *Isaiah* 50:4-7; (2) *Philippians* 2:6-11; (3) *Mark* 15:1-39.

TODAY'S RESPONSES

PSALM: Create a clean heart in me O God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: If you serve me, follow me, says the Lord; and where I am, my servant will also be.

SAINTS (GREAT) OF THE WEEK:

(1) St Patrick (17 March Feast day) - Born in Roman Britain at the end of the 4th century, he died in Ireland mid-400 AD. As a missionary bishop he endured many hardships and faced opposition even from his friends and fellow Christians. Nevertheless, he worked hard to conciliate, to evangelize, and to educate local chieftains and

their families. He is remembered for his simplicity and pastoral care, his humble trust in God, and for his kindly preaching of the gospel to the very people who had enslaved him in his youth.

(2) St Joseph (19 March Solemnity) - Nothing is known of St Joseph except what is said of him in the Gospels. He was a carpenter; he accepted the will of God; and he supported Mary and raised Jesus. From the human character of his son we can see that he was a good and responsible father. He is widely venerated as a patron of artisans who honourably do good work with the gifts God has given them, and of workers in general. To those who exercise the role of an adoptive parent, whether formally or informally, whether over one child or as the support of a whole family, he is a source of inspiration. 'St Joseph, carer of Christ, guardian of God, pray for us.'
