All Saints commemorates our ancestors in faith who were outstanding in their witness to Christ and in their love for fellow



humanity (although some have acknowledged through their writings and stories that they didn't necessarily start out that way!). Just as deeds of great endeavour by intrepid adventurers can inspire and encourage us, so calling to mind the extra-ordinary lives of saints can inspire and encourage us in our own faith journeys. But further, they are more than just passive historical persons of curiosity. As they are one with God in the fulness of life that we yet journey towards, so we can implore their intercessory support to walk with us and pray for us yet, because we are all one in God who is not constrained by space or time. May their ongoing care and prayers for us help us to be grateful for God's love, mercy and compassion, be faithful to our callings in life whatever they may be, and be generous in our response, as the saints were.

ALL SOULS DAY - Next Saturday, 02 Nov:

Holy Souls – Offering a Mass and praying for the repose of the souls of deceased ancestors is a time-



honoured practice of the Church. St. Paul prayed for his dead friend Onesiphorus, "May the Lord grant him to find mercy" (2 Timothy 1:16-18). The Gospel of Matthew infers that certain offences can be forgiven in this age, but certain others in the age to come (Matt 12:32). The Old Testament recounts that 'an expiatory sacrifice was offered for the dead, so that they might be released from their sin' (2 Maccabees 12:44-46). Early Christian gravestones include the inscriptions 'Please pray for me' (see Catholic Encyclopaedia). So we take time to pray for our imperfect, yet ultimately Godseeking dead. In the words of Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist: "In the tender compassion of our God the dawn from on high shall break upon us, to shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death, and guide our feet into the way of peace." (Luke 1:78-79).

To have a Mass offered for deceased family and friends, place an envelope with their names in it in the box at the front of the church altars throughout the month of November. Any offerings that are included will be donated to a suitable charity. Also, there will prayer candle lighting opportunities before and after Saturday and Sunday Masses.



*On behalf of the Holy See, Cardinal Ayuso sent well



*As the world marks UN Disarmament Week, Pope Francis has denounced the global arms trade, describing it as the industry that generates the most profit. Imagine, he said, "making profit from death." ... With more than 90 countries involved in external conflicts, the need for arms control has never been more urgent."

*Pope at general audience: Invite Holy Spirit to protect your marriage and children.

*Pope Francis reiterates his appeal for peace in the world, saying the fatality statistics coming from Ukraine are "terrible" and that "Palestine is suffering inhumane attacks.

*Fr. Gustavo Gutierrez, champion of the poor, dies aged 96. A pioneer of Liberation Theology, he challenged the Church to reconsider its role in a world marked by social inequality, and to commit more fully to the defence of the weak.

*Typhoon-hit Catholic Dioceses in the Philippines have activated emergency response units in areas affected by torrential rains.

*Milan hosts a festival dedicated to rights of young people.
