SCRIPTURE READINGS TODAY

- (1) *Isaiah 50:4-7.* Jesus Christ is presented as the "Suffering Servant" of Isaiah's prophecy.
- (2) *Philippians 2:6-11.* In Paul's Letter to the people of Philippi Jesus' saving mission is highlighted.
- (3) Mark 15:1-39. In the first part of today's Gospel Jesus is welcomed enthusiastically into Jerusalem as king and saviour. We are also told how he wept over Jerusalem, cleansed the Temple there and cursed a barren fig tree. Subsequently, in the second part of the Passion reading, we reflect on Jesus' unjust trial, humiliation, cruel torture and crucifixion.

Next Week (Easter Sunday) Scripture Readings: (1) Acts 10:34,37-43 (2) Colossians 3:1-4; (3) John 20:1-9.

VATICAN NEWS (20/3/24): *Pope Francis praised the virtue of prudence, commenting that Jesus does not only want us to become saints, but "intelligent" ones, and exercising the virtue of prudence helps us become so. *Under the banner 'Migrants challenge us as Christians' the pope urged bishops from the border regions of Colombia and Costa Rica, along with the Bishops of Panama, to "eradicate the indifference" toward

migrants and refugees passing through the Darien Gap between Panama and Colombia.

THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK - From Br Mark McKeon, De La Salle Brothers, Bethlehem University, Israel-Palestine. 18 March 2024.

This time two years ago I was involved in the formation of seminarians at Holy Cross seminary in Auckland. In September 2022 I returned to Bethlehem University which is located in the West Bank of Palestine. We are just 8 kilometres from but Israeli checkpoint Jerusalem, the "separation wall" makes it challenging endeavour to travel that short distance. You have no doubt been horrified with all the images coming out of Gaza. It has been heart breaking for me living with people personally affected by this human tragedy. Many of our students and employees have family members in Gaza. One of our faculty lost 12 members of her family when a missile struck the church in which they were sheltering. The war has meant that our classes are taught in hybrid fashion, with some attending face to face and others who join online. For those who join online it is either because it is too dangerous to travel due to potential settler attacks within the West Bank or they cannot afford the transport costs. Families lost a steady source of income when the borders were closed preventing their fathers from working in the construction sector in Israel. It is sad to say there is a sense of hopelessness here at the moment. The people here feel forgotten. I am witnessing first hand it is the innocent that suffer most in a time of war. Yet this is a place of blessing for me. I love the people here. I will be in the Old City of Jerusalem for the last days of Holy Week and will keep your communities at St John the Baptist, St Peter's, and Our Lady of Peace in my prayers. Please pray for us here, that a spirit of compassion may penetrate the hardened hearts of those on both sides of the war who are making the decisions. Peace and blessing. Brother Mark.
