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Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On October 11th 2011, Pope Benedict wrote an Apostolic Letter, 'The door of Faith (Porta Fidei)' announcing the Year of Faith, that is to begin on October 11th 2012. On that date 50 years ago the Church began the Second Vatican Council that Pope John XXIII had ushered in. For those of you who can remember, it was an exciting time full of hope and expectation. Pope John had thrown open the windows and doors of the Church to better reach out to the world. Under the power of the Holy Spirit, the Bishops who gathered responded to the challenge and produced some remarkable documents that called on all members of the Church to make use of their gifts and talents for the Kingdom, and to reach out and introduce others to Jesus Christ, Our Saviour.

That challenge of the Council remains and when we look around our world today, in this Third Millennium, we realise how many people have yet to hear of our loving and merciful God.

Pope Benedict, in speaking about our response for this new evangelisation, mentions two vital truths in his letter – "to rediscover the joy of believing and the enthusiasm for communicating the faith" (\$7).

In the early Church to become Christian and not share your faith would be considered inconceivable. We need to regain that enthusiasm and be ready to introduce others to Jesus Christ.

During the year there will be special celebrations, faith groups and seminars to enable us to deepen our faith and encourage us to share that faith on life's pilgrim journey.

There will be the opportunity to study, pray and reflect on these Council documents and the Catechism to give us a deeper and appropriate knowledge of our faith.

I do hope this will be a special 'springtime' in your faith and that you respond to that Spirit-filled moment or opportunity to bring another person or persons through "in opening a door of faith" (Acts 14:27) to accept Jesus' invitation to new life.

May all who suffer pain, illness or disease realise that they are chosen to be saints and know that they are joined to Christ in his suffering for the salvation of the world.

Prayer for the Dying

From the Roman Missal

God of power and mercy, you have made death itself the gateway to eternal life. Look with love on our dying brother/sister and make him/her one with your Son in his suffering and death, that, sealed with the blood of Christ, he/she may come before you free from sin.

Eternal Rest

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen.

Prayers Immediately after Death

From the Roman Ritual

Immediately after death has occurred, all may kneel while one of those present leads the following prayer:

Saints of God, come to his/her aid! Come to meet him/her, angels of the Lord!

R. Receive his/her soul and present him/her to God the Most High.

May Christ, who called you, take you to himself; may angels lead you to Abraham's side. R.

Give him/her eternal rest, O Lord, and may your light shine on him/her for ever. R.

The following prayer is added:

Let us pray.

All powerful and merciful God, we commend to you N., your servant. In your mercy and love, blot out the sins he/she has committed through human weakness. In this world he/she has died: let him/her live with you for ever. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Byzantine Prayer for the Deceased

God of the spirits and of all flesh, who hast trampled death and annihilated the devil and given life to your world, may you yourself, O Lord, grant to the soul of your deceased servant N. rest in a place of light, a verdant place, a place of freshness, from where suffering, pain and cries are far removed. Do thou, O good and compassionate God forgive every fault committed by him in word, work or thought because there is no man who lives and does not sin. You alone are without sin and your justice is justice throughout the ages and your word is truth. Since you, O Christ our God, are the resurrection, the life and the repose of your deceased servant N., we give you glory together with your un-begotten Father and your most holy, good and life-creating Spirit, now and always and forever and ever. Amen.
