As I write this we are still very much in the centre of this Covid pandemic and will be remaining in level 4 lockdown until at least next Wednesday 1st September. If we do move down to level 3 next week then we will still be unable to gather for Sunday or weekday liturgies in our churches and our schools will remain closed. It is possible to hold funerals or weddings with a limit of ten people physically attending but at this stage we are encouraged to stay at home.

This is a difficult time we are all facing and has disrupted the personal and working lives of most people. A time like this calls on our faith to be patient with ourselves and caring of others by carrying out sacrifices for the good of the community.
