Laudato Si' reflection



In today's Gospel, one son ignores his Father's command, but then changes his mind and helps with the mahi in the vineyard. The other son agrees verbally but then goes his own way.

Many of us are changing our minds and our behaviour. As the Pope notes, "For all our limitations, gestures of generosity, solidarity and care cannot but well up within us, since we were made for love." (LS 58) To care for our environment is an act of self-and-other care. It feels good to work with others to allow healing to occur. In fact, often doing the mahi helps change our minds. In this period of 'deep crisis' which involves 'bold decisions' (LS 59), how can we each belong more fully to our beautiful world? Let us pray for guidance here, as participants in a world that needs us all.
