The Holy Land has been badly hit by COVID due to the lack of tourism with the people suffering in places such as Bethlehem. This collection goes to the support of the holy places in the Holy Land and also to the social and pastoral work for the local communities that still live there, such as scholarships for young people, employment schemes and medical care for the poor. 1. GUIDELINES FOR HYGIENE IN PARISH LITURGIES

While we are in Level one at the moment in New Zealand, there is still a worldwide COVID pandemic and we can do our part for prevention by carrying out practical hygiene practices in the liturgy.

With that in mind, we will have these guidelines for parishes in the Diocese during **Holy Week**:

- Holy Communion under one kind and no communal sharing of the chalice.
- Holy Communion to be received in the hand.
- Removal of holy water from entrance of church.
- No physical touching at sign of peace.
- On Holy Thursday, there will be no physical washing of feet.
- On Good Friday, no kissing or touching of the crucifix at the Veneration of the Cross. (There is provision in the liturgy for the congregation to venerate the cross in other ways)

2. SUNDAY MASS OBLIGATION

At our last COVID level change, the Sunday Mass obligation was dispensed for those weekend Masses in the Diocese due to the lack of notice. At this point in time the Sunday Mass obligation is effective in the Diocese.


TUI MOTU - APRIL 2021
