Christ and the Spirit

Jesus gave us God's spirit, our Guide. The Spirit invites us to follow Jesus, to love God, and to love others. When we say "Yes" to the Spirit, we know we are children of God.

The sacraments of the Church celebrate the work of the Spirit in our lives. We first received the gift of the Spirit in our baptism; this was our first step as children of God. The Spirit urges us to take part in God's forgiveness with the sacrament of Reconciliation, especially when we don't follow the command of Jesus to treat others with love. In the Eucharist, the bishop or priest prays the Spirit will come upon the gifts of bread and wine so they will become the body and blood of Jesus. Through the power of God's Spirit, the Risen Jesus becomes present to us in the Eucharist. We become one with Jesus when we receive him in Communion. Finally, the Spirit gives us his gifts in Confirmation: fortitude, counsel, understanding, knowledge, wisdom, reverence, and awe of others, as ways to show our love for them.

As the Spirit works in our lives, we are changed for the better. We might not feel different (in fact we might not feel anything). When we pray and when we act for the good of others, however, we know that the Spirit is helping us.
