In the gospel, Jesus shared bread with his friends. In his culture, sharing bread was a sign of friendship and commitment. People share these same bonds at family dinners and other special occasions.

Share some fresh bread at your next family meal. Involve your family members in making the bread. Then, when your family is first gathered around the table, bless God for his goodness, break the bread, and give

a small piece to each members. Remind your family members they are bonded to each other, like a loaf of bread. Compare this family "agape" with Communion when Jesus united his followers with shared bread.


In today's Gospel, in communion with God's love, we are asked to lovingly give of ourselves – to care for those in need -"You give them something to eat" (Luke 9:13).

Eucharist

Based on Lk 9:11-17 In Eucharist, Jesus feeds us with his own Body and Blood. When Jesus multiplied the loaves and fish to feed the people, he gave people a sign of the life he would share. Five loaves and two fish fed five thousand people. His single Body would feed millions and millions of followers. But unlike the loaves and fish that fed people for the day, his Body fees us for a life we will live with God forever.
